

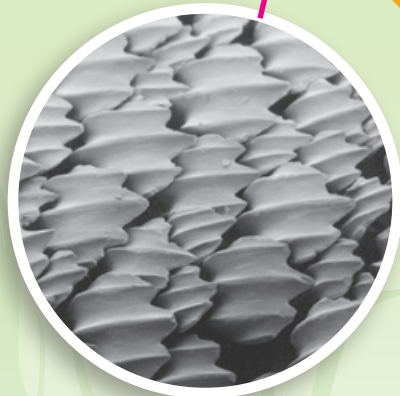
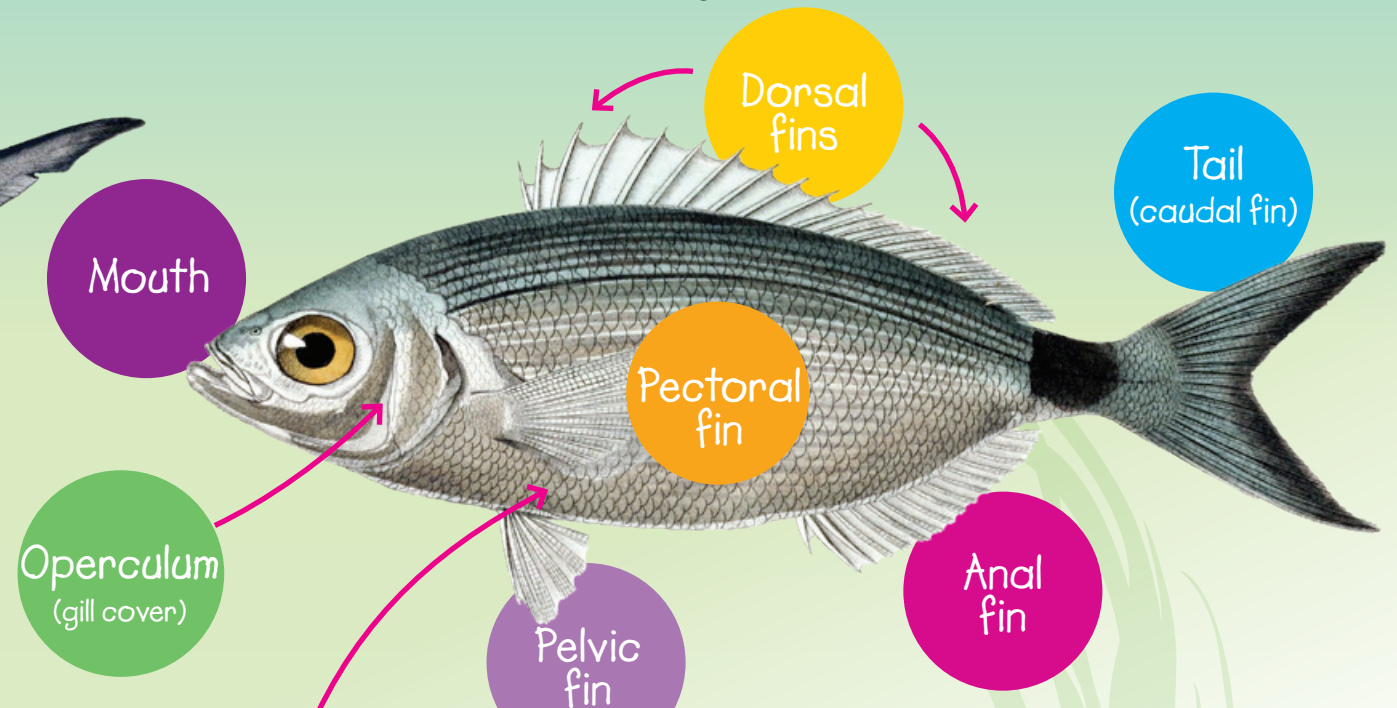
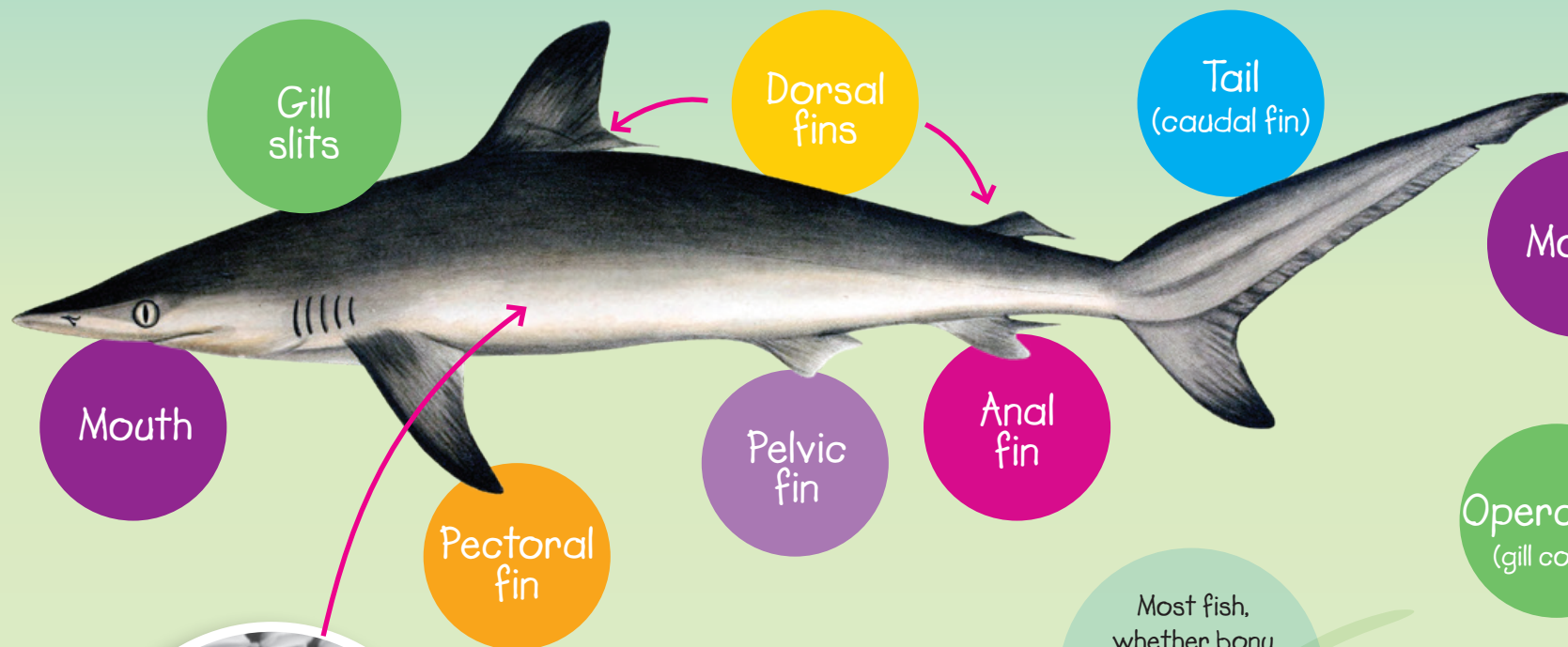
SPOT THE DIFFERENCE

Did you know that all fish within the ocean have a skeleton made of either bone or cartilage? Cartilage is what your ears and the tip of your nose are made out of!

There are three things that are the same about these two different fish and six things that are different. Can you find them?

Cartilaginous fish habitat

The majority of cartilaginous fish live in marine or saltwater habitats. These fish can be found in all the seas and oceans of the world.

Most fish, whether bony or cartilaginous, have five pairs of gills.
